One Hand Helping Another: MSOP And GBN

Although it sounds cliché, it is true still that lighthouses are not in competition. We are happy to welcome The Gospel Broadcasting Network (GBN) to the Memphis area, and we look forward to working together in spreading the saving gospel of Christ. The work at GBN is now under the oversight of the elders of the Southaven church of Christ. Having worked as the local preacher from 1991-2007, I know these men, and I have the utmost confidence in their faithfulness and soundness. The article below is from Don Blackwell, the very capable Director of GBN. We commend it to you, and we look forward to many years of being "laborers together with God" (1 Cor. 3:9).

CAN YOU HELP GBN WITH THE LIGHTING GRID FOR OUR NEW STUDIO?

GBN has just completed the move from Ringgold, Georgia to our new location in Olive Branch, Mississippi, just 7 miles from the MSOP campus. Some items have been easier to move than others, but none have proven to be more difficult than the lighting system.

The lighting system used in the Ringgold facility was an age-old technology that utilized oversized incandescent bulbs with power needs in the 750 to 1,000 watt range per bulb, and numerous bulbs were needed for every set. The amount of electricity a system of this type utilizes to record a single program is comparable to several homes! In addition, most of the electricity consumed becomes heat, which then must be removed via air conditioning. The power needs of such a system were actually higher than the utility company in Olive Branch could provide without having to significantly upgrade their distribution system at our expense.

Thankfully, new technology is available to help overcome these obstacles. High-efficiency LED lighting is now the standard, as it uses a small fraction of the electricity to power the lights, and they put off very little heat. The power for the entire LED system could actually be run through a single 20-amp circuit. While these LED fixtures aren't cheap, they are much less expensive than the cost of upgrading the electrical system and installing additional air conditioning that would be required for the old lighting system.

GBN is currently in the process of raising the \$75,000 needed to make this cost-saving and necessary expenditure. If you know of individuals or congregations who would be willing to assist with this need, it would help to complete this new facility.

The GBN Grand Opening and Building Dedication is scheduled for March 30th at 3:00pm. This is the Saturday before the start of the MSOP Lectures. All MSOP graduates and their families are invited to attend the event.

THE WORLD MISSIONS PROGRAM MEMPHIS SCHOOL OF PREACHING

There is a tremendous need for people all over the world to hear the Gospel of Christ. Concerning the commission from Christ, the inspired Mark wrote; "And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned" (Mark 16:15–16). Before one can believe and be baptized, he must first hear the Word of God (cf. Rom. 10:13-17). With over seven billion people in the world today, the Lord's church has a great task. We are to get God's saving message to every individual in the world. Tremendous task? Indeed! Yet, it can be done! The Lord has never required of us something that is impossible to accomplish. He has even promised to be with us (Mat. 28:20).

However, there needs to be men and their families who are qualified and properly trained. Paul instructed Timothy; "And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also" (2 Tim. 2:2). With that in mind, the Memphis School of Preaching began a "World Missions" Program" in 2012. Faithful men who wish to help take the Gospel around the world are encouraged to enroll in this program. The Mission program is one-year in length and is open to those who have some prior training either in a School of Preaching, a Christian college, or perhaps have some life experiences that help qualify them for this work. The studies in this program include such things as culture and customs of the area where one will be working, communication skills (using the internet and broadcasting), doctrinal challenges, challenges the family will face on the field, the language one needs to know in the country where he plans to evangelize, etc.

Memphis School of Preaching has thirty-two, three bedroom apartments, on the school campus located in Germantown, where students and their families live. While living here, they will be among others who are of like precious faith and have dedicated themselves to the preaching of the Gospel. One of the current students that is going through the program, wrote, "The 'World Mission Program' at the Memphis School of Preaching has been a blessing to the Evans' family. This program has given us the opportunity to study Swahili, the local language of Tanzania, as well as the Tanzanian culture. We are thankful that we have been blessed with the opportunity to raise support for the work in Iringa, Tanzania (www.missiontanzania.net) while making preparations in the World Mission Program. We are now better prepared to face the challenges that may arise on the mission field" (Adam Evans).


