

WHICH CHURCH?

Through the years, Billy Graham's My Answer newspaper column has provided interesting and often helpful reading. But his answer to one inquiry was not at all helpful.

QUESTION: In our city there are 35 different denominations. From my reading of the Bible, I cannot believe that Christ founded all these different religions. How can I tell which one of the 35 is the one founded by Christ?

Billy Graham's reply appeared to be influenced by a desire to try to defend the existing denominational system. He made statements that have no Bible basis, such as:

We speak of the church visible and the church invisible... But within every denomination there are committed Christians. These comprise the church invisible.... If you are trying to find the true church, don't look to anyone in particular - look in all of them.

COMMENTS: Graham speaks of "the church visible and the church invisible" but the Bible does not. The New Testament speaks of but one church and it was certainly visible.

Billy Graham tells the questioner that if he is trying to find the one true church, he should "not look to anyone in particular." But if the inquirer finds the true church, it will be "one in particular." Jesus established only one! Jesus said, "I will build my church" (Mat. 16:18).

Finding The Church Founded By Jesus

There is just one way to answer the question: Go to the New Testament. Disregard the many conflicting claims of men. Conduct vour own investigation.

Jesus said: "The seed is the word of God" (Luke 8:11). Whenever and wherever the Word of God is proclaimed and obeyed in its original purity, it will bear the same fruit. Seed produces after its kind. This assures that when the Bible is followed in every matter of faith in our (Continued on Page 2)

SCRIPTURAL BALANCE OF SPEAKERS AND WRITERS

A total of sixty speakers participated with both men and women presenting lessons orally and for the printed volumes. Christian ladies taught women's classes each morning and afternoon from Monday through Thursday. These were for women and girls only. They dealt with topics especially applicable for our lovely Christian women and Christian girls. These classes were well-attended.

There was a beautiful balance touching age and experience. Veterans of the faith most holy who have preached the gospel for fifty, sixty or seventy years participated. These have borne the burden and heat of the day nearly all their lives. Their lessons enriched all of us. They were able to speak from the overflow.

Younger men who have preached the gospel ten, twenty, thirty, forty or nearly fifty years, our new veterans of the faith, contributed immensely to the overall success of the lectureship. Those of us who are older view with appreciation and admiration these younger soldiers of Calvary who are and will carry the torch of truth the remnant of their days on earth. They have not allowed this torch of truth to touch ground in their sincere, earnest reception of it. This is what the peerless Paul had in mind in 2 Timothy 2:2. These younger men are faithful and able—the two necessary qualifications set out by the apostle Paul to his son in the gospel Timothy.

SCRIPTURAL BALANCE BETWEEN FIRST PRINCIPLES AND CHRISTIAN LIVING PRINCIPLES

Luke wrote one book on conversions—Acts; five New Testament penmen wrote twenty-one epistles and Revelation on sanctification or Christian living. The gospel plan of salvation was emphasized; it was not demeaned, downgraded or ignored. God's second law of pardon was emphasized. We heard what we should put off and what we should put on as Paul stated in Colossians 3 and Titus 2. Emphasized were inward living, outward living and upward living or living soberly, righteously and godly (Tit. 2:11-12).

We learned about the <u>wealth</u> of the church, the <u>walk</u> of the church and the <u>warfare</u> of the church much like Paul set forth in his eloquent Ephesian epistle. There was an exposure of error, and the inculcation of truth. These were Scripturally balanced all the way through.

LECTURESHIP HIGHLIGHTS

The MSOP and the Forest Hill congregation hosted this great effort. They rolled out to all who came the red carpet of gracious hospitality. They made us feel warmly welcome. Delicious meals were served each day at noon with neighbouring congregations helping in providing and serving the food. Keith and Dorothy Mosher were honoured with a dinner on Monday. Close to 600 attended this festive occasion. The Alumni and Friends' Dinner was held Tuesday evening with Toney Smith as speaker. The Gospel Journal Dinner was held Wednesday with B. J. Clarke as speaker.

Present Monday night were 1159. The attendance remained good through Thursday night when I spoke. The singing was outstanding; the prayers were sincere; the fellowship was a foretaste of what heaven will surely be like in full fruition.

time, it will produce a church identical to the New Testament church of the *first century*. It will be the same church. It will be the Lord's church

So, in conducting your own investigation, go to the New Testament. Jesus' church was referred to most often simply as *the church*. Individual congregations were just called "*churches of Christ*" (Romans 16:16).

Members of the Lord's church were just *Christians*, not a particular kind of Christian. "And the disciples were called Christians..." (Acts 11:26).

The worship of the Lord's church consisted of **singing** (Ephesians 5:19), **praying and teaching** (Acts 2:42), and, upon the first day of every week, **the Lord's Supper** (Acts 20:7), and **giving** of their means (1 Corinthians 16:1-2).

The plan of salvation the church proclaimed was that the gospel must be heard (Romans 10:17), and believed (Mark 16:16). Believers must repent (Acts 2:38), confess their faith in Jesus Christ as the Son of God (Romans 10:10), and then be baptized into Christ (Galatians 3:27) to have their sins "washed away" (Acts 22:16).

Then the Lord *added* the saved each day to *His church* (Acts 2:47). They did not join any denomination.

Jesus promises an eternal home in heaven to all who obey the gospel and then live the pure, faithful life of a Christian (Rev. 2:7, 10).

These are just some of the things an investigation will reveal. Time and effort will be needed, but it can be done. The Bible was written so that every responsible person can understand it well enough to believe it, obey it, and **be saved**.
