Evangelizing Mitchell's Plain

The official statistics show that the population of Mitchell's Plain is 398,647, but independent surveys suggest that it could be closer to 1.3 million people. "Therefore said he unto them, The harvest truly is great, but the labourers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest" (Luke 10:2).

Mitchell's Plain is one of the poorest townships in South Africa, with a rate of 38% unemployment. It is best known for its gangsterism and drug problem. In a recent study, done by the University of Stellenbosch, it was found that Mitchell's Plain is the teen drug capital of South Africa. Also, murder, violent crime, and rape statistics, etc., are of the highest in South Africa. Another challenge facing the community is HIV/AIDS. In one study, 6.9% of the adult population was tested, with 1 out of 5 testing positive.

These statistics are scary but the scariest statistic of all is that there are only about 400 Christians in Mitchell's Plain. There is something wrong with this statistic and something has got to be done about it. This lost and dying community, in which I grew up, can be saved by the Gospel of Christ. All we need to do is to preach it to them!

We are told to go and preach the Gospel (Mat. 28:18-20). Many have wondered how this may be done. Well, the answer is simple really. If you cannot go yourself, then help someone who can! Today I appeal to all Christians to get involved with the work in Mitchell's Plain by helping to support a preacher who is from this community, loves this community and understands how to work in this community. Brethren, I need your help, please! God bless you as you pray and consider this plea!
